Exposure Compensation:

Set-up:

Set up sheets of white and black Bristol board. (Idea: put two chairs on a table and tape the Bristol board to the chair. The photographer then has a convenient working height.

- 1. Set your camera to Aperture priority. Choose the lowest f number (f. 1.8 2.8 3.8)
- 2. Set your ISO to 400
- 3. Turn on autofocus.
- 4. Set camera metering mode to Spot or Centre Weighted and set up in one position.
- 5. Point the metering spot at the black object so it fills the entire metering area. Take the picture.
- 6. Change the exposure compensation so it is set to underexpose by one stop -1, or a scale with tick marks and one should be labeled '-1'. Take a picture.
- 7. Reset exposure bias to zero 0 and point your camera to the white object so that if fills the metering area. Take a picture.
- 8. Change the exposure bias to +1 and take a photo.

You will have four images. Looking at the two sets, which exposure makes the object look more like its actual colour.
